

IIT Palakkad put up a good fight in Quiz, winning 4 top 10 positions among the six quizzes held. Ankit Singh, Prasanna Venkatesan and Rajath R made a strong team, winning the 9th position in the MELA Quiz and in the General Quiz, and 10th in the Business Quiz and in the

India Quiz-which was a tough one; However the team felt that it had underperformed in sci-tech compared to the previous year as they could only secure the 12th position.

51- Hour Film Making

The event indeed turned out to be one requiring speed and quick thinking and the crew achieved the 11th, coming up with a good storyline(Samuel Paleti), script(Prasanna Venkatesan) and editing(Navaneeth A, alongside Iqbal), creating a short film titled LOST on the theme "Don't try"(Director: Mohammed Iqbal, Camera: Immanuel Jufel and Satish Chandra and the cast). Screenwriting

Kavyanjali, the Hindi poetry slam, a stage for young IlTians to convey their expressions on various themes: from poems on social issues to those on complex human consciousness. Divyansh Khare bagged the 11th position.

Group Dance

This was the first time IIT Palakkad took part in the group dance and the team finished 12th place. The major setback was the lesser number of participants in our team(12), compared to those(40) in some of the older IITs. Despite that the troupe got points for choreography, creativity and impact.

Stage Play

IIT Palakkad's team secured 14th position in stage play. The play was based on the struggles and conflicts of a doctor when he is diagnosed with stage four cancer, only to know afterwards that it was a misunderstanding.

Band

IIT Palakkad had a better performance in band compared to last year, achieving the 16th position. The performances consisted of a couple of slow songs including a malayalam rap which was well received by the audience.

Solo Singing

Sangadala Gayathri stood 27th among all the singers. Though she had a good start, she was made to restart her song due to some technical errors(the tanpura being too loud) and unfortunately, the next time she wasn't able perform as well as before probably because she might have panicked or thought she had sung wrong the first time(when asked to restart).

Overall Result

Our contingent consisted of 39 students and we bagged the 17th position overall out of the 21 IITs that participated in the 3rd Inter IIT Cultural Meet.
