SPORTACUS 2019

The Intra College Sports Meet of IIT Palakkad (named as Sportacus for this semester) kicked off on the 16th of March, 2019. The meet lasted for two days. There were four franchises to make the meet competitive and energetic. Players in all events belonged to any one of the four franchises: Thunderhawks, Spartans, Phoenix, Dementors. The pool for the auction in different sports was independent of each other.

The standouts from this vear's meet are the increased participation from the girls and a better schedule management by the Sports Council. Another addition to this year's meet was the Trump card system, where managers place the Trump card before the match begins. The rules of the Trump card state that if whose the team



manager places the Trump card wins, the team's points would be doubled while were they to lose, the team pays a penalty of losing half the points they would obtain for their respective position in that game.

A noteworthy mention to the NSS volunteers who worked hard behind the scenes keeping track of the stats and tabulating the scores ensured the smooth conduct of the event.

Overview

The franchise heads chose their players for each sport on an Auction based system with virtual money that was held prior to the meet. Initially scheduled to be done in a day, the auctions extended to a total of two days. Though there were initial discrepancies for eg. in the basketball sport, the organisers and the bidders came to a consensus to resolve the issue. Overall, the auction saw a smooth bidding from all the heads. The choice of each player was crucial to not just the sport but for the franchise as a whole and as the results show, each franchise had its own share of good deals.

It would not have been possible to conduct sports like Kho-kho and Throwball exclusively for girls had the number been less. Thanks to Teena, Anagha and Tulasi who also helped me convince the girls to play. Salma also coordinated really well from the other campus. If she was not there, then it would have been really difficult to connect with junior girls. A special thanks to her and Sanjay too who was like the captain of the ship. Also thanks to all the Sports Council members who played an important role to make Sportacus a success."

Views by Purav Ghanshyam Kothiya (Team Phoenix) :

" It was an amazing experience. We planned out the strategies one night before the auction and chose the players accordingly to make the best team possible.
