ABSTRACT OF THE TALK

By examining women's writing in Kerala from the 19th to the mid 20th C, ranging from petitions, poems, letters and diaries, this presentation wishes to return to a couple of questions that have been recurrent themes in feminist thought. One is the thorny, and unresolved, relationship between patriarchy/power and the social. The second is about the relationship between time, form and the writer. Do women in certain periods write in particular ways? What clues do these literary traces provide us with to think about gender, writing, or temporality? These are some of the questions I hope to address in this presentation.

Dr. G. Arunima works as a Professor at Centre for Women's Studies, School of Social Sciences, Jawaharlal Nehru University, India. Research and publications engage both the historical and the contemporary contexts of India, focusing particularly on cultural, visual and material texts, and rethinking the politics of the contemporary. Thematically, research areas of interest can be divided broadly into the study of family and kinship, both historically and theoretically; different aspects of questions of aesthetics and modernities; visual culture and theory; and religion and faith practices.
